FELINE AGILITY HEADLINES AT NEBRASKA HUMANE SOCIETY EXPO

MANASQUAN, NJ – July 20, 2010 -- Feline Agility Competition, a program of the Cat Fanciers' Association, Inc. (CFA), wowed the mid-west at the recent Nebraska Humane Society Expo held in Omaha, NE. Agility Ringmaster and trainer, Jill Archibald, held a demonstration ring and offered to train spectators to run a cat through the agility ring. Over 100 people took her up on her offer, learning how to teach a cat to weave their way through poles, jump through hoops and over bars, and race through tunnels.

With over 500 spectators watching the activities, Ms. Archibald's Japanese Bobtails strutted their stuff to the cheers of those in attendance. The Bobtails are a very active breed and well-suited to the challenges of a feline agility course. Most cats quickly will develop a feeling for running the course and enjoy the activity immensely. Similar to the canine agility competitions, cats are scored depending upon how quickly they complete the course.

The Nebraska Humane Society Expo was a first for the society, and organizers were thrilled with the attendance and very proud of hosting the first Feline Agility Competition held outside of a CFA cat show.
