Proposed Constitutional Amendments

-1- Abu Simbel Cat Club, Rex Oriental Cat Club [presented by Yoshiko Moriya]

RESOLVED: amend the CFA Constitution, Article III – Membership, Section 4 – Regional Assignment as follows:

Designate the existing paragraph of said section as “a.”

a. New members of the Association will be assigned to the Region in which is found the mailing address of the Secretary of the new member at the time of application for membership. Any club, for which the secretary(s) has resided outside of the current assigned region for a period of five (5) years, and/or the activities of the club have been conducted outside of the current assigned region for a period of five (5) years, shall be reassigned to the region of the current secretary's residence.

AND add a new paragraph “b.” to the section as follows:

b. Reassignments of member clubs from other Regions to Region 8 shall not be effective until approved by a majority of the then existing Region 8 clubs. The Regional Director of Region 8 shall, within thirty (30) days after having been so requested by the Secretary of the club seeking reassignment, poll the existing Region 8 clubs seeking their approval or disapproval. The poll may be conducted, and responded to, by mail, fax or email. Responses must be received by the Regional Director of Region 8 within thirty (30) days after the poll has been initiated in

order to be counted. The results of the poll shall be reported promptly by the Regional Director of Region 8 to the CFA Central Office.

RESOLVED: amend the CFA Constitution by modifying Article VI – Officers and Directors, Section 2 – Elections, to change the term for elected officers and directors from 2 years to 3 years as indicated below:

ARTICLE VI - OFFICERS AND DIRECTORS

Section 2 - Elections

a. General. The President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer and Regional Directors shall be elected every three years starting in 2008 ~~in even-numbered years~~. The Directors-at-Large shall be elected every three years starting in 2007 ~~in odd-numbered years~~. The term of office for every position shall begin on the Sunday following the close of the Annual Meeting of the Association.

All elections shall be conducted by mail ballot, each eligible member club having one (1) vote. The candidate receiving the most votes for an office or regional directorship shall be deemed elected, regardless of the number of candidates running. Once elected, an officer or director shall serve for a term of three (3) ~~two (2)~~ years, or until his/her successor is elected and qualifies, except as provided for in paragraph f. of this Article.

RESOLVED: amend CFA Show Rules by adding the following:

ARTICLE X, ACHIEVEMENT WINNER (The current Article X and subsequent articles will be advanced one number.)

10.01 A cat eligible for and shown in the Kitten, Championship, or Premiership Class will compete for Achievement Winner (AW) points in any type of ring, e.g. Allbreed, Longhair/Shorthair or Breed Specialty.

10.02 Determination of show points.

a. Points will be allotted the same as Regional/National points.

1. Best cat/kitten - one point for each cat/kitten defeated.

2. 2nd Best cat/kitten - 95% of the points awarded to Best cat/kitten, 3rd Best cat/kitten 90%, 4th Best 85%, 5th Best 80%, etc.

3. Best of Breed/Division - one point for each kitten/cat/premier defeated within the breed/division.

4. 2nd Best of Breed/Division - 95% of the points awarded to Best of Breed/Division.

5. Points achieved in individual rings are added to determine an entry's total points for the show.

b. In all cases an entry will receive the points from only one award per ring - that which carried more points.

10.03 Any registered kitten placing in the Finals, or receiving Best or Second Best BOB/BOD, will receive points toward Achievement Winner.

a. 500 points are required for Achievement Winner in Mainland US, Canada, Japan and the International Division. 200 points are required in Alaska, Hawaii, Russia, Asia (except Japan), Mexico, Central America, South America, and United Kingdom (England, Scotland, Wales, Northern Ireland).

10.04 Any cat in the Championship Class, after achieving the title of Grand Champion, will receive points toward Achievement Winner.

a. 1000 points are required for Achievement Winner in mainland US, Canada, Japan and the International Division. 400 points are required in Alaska, Hawaii, Russia, Asia (except Japan), Mexico, Central America, South America, and United Kingdom (England, Scotland, Wales, Northern Ireland).

10.05 Any cat in the Premiership Class, after achieving the title of Grand Premier, will receive points toward Achievement Winner.

a. 500 points are required for Achievement Winner in Mainland US, Canada, Japan and the International Division. 200 points are required in Alaska, Hawaii, Russia, Asia (except Japan), Mexico, Central America, South America, and United Kingdom (England, Scotland, Wales, Northern Ireland).

10.06 Wins made in Kitten competition may not be transferred to Championship or Premiership records. Wins made in Championship competition may not be transferred to Premiership records. However, titles won in Kitten or Championship are retained.

10.07 Points must be won under at least three (3) different Judges.

10.08 Cats that have completed the point requirement for Achievement Winner will automatically be confirmed by the Central Office. Certification of confirmation will be mailed as soon as possible after show records are received and wins have been recorded. *
